Joined Up Conference 2022

This year's conference was held in-person on Saturday 5th March at STC (St Thomas, Crookes) and Wesley Hall (Crookes). Our keynote speakers were Sophie, Bishop of Doncaster, and Hannah Chukwu, Assistant Editor at Penguin

Books. In addition, we had a wide range of interesting workshops, including:

Serving your School: Finding New Opportunities, Suicide and Young People

Working with Young People in Poverty, Mentoring to Support Growth, Not Change

An Introduction to Child Exploitation (Trauma informed working and engaging with young people), Working with Girls / Child Sexual Exploitation

Chaplaincy, Welcomed by the Family...and many more.

Around 150 folks gathered together, fewer people than usual, but given the understandable and continuing Covid nervousness it was an encouraging attendance.

The aims/vision of the school chaplaincy project are:

- to start/encourage conversation around school chaplaincy
- to explore the challenges/opportunities school chaplaincy presents
- to start to equip/resource those wishing to become school chaplains
- to provide opportunities to talk with school chaplains
- to build a supportive community of school chaplains
- to offer further training to established school chaplains

We strongly believe school chaplains can make a huge difference to a school community, that the pandemic has made chaplaincy even more vital. Chaplaincy offers an incredible opportunity to 'do life' with young people and teachers where they are.

The Queen's Christian Faith

We have also ordered some copies as prizes for a competition at their jubilee fair this week."



Prayer

We wrote a prayer for the new school year:

Listening God, I place the pupils and teachers of my local school (name it) into your hands. Please provide the school community with peace, patience, positivity, energy and creativity. Help it to be a place of learning, hope, compassion, understanding, generosity and sympathy. Amen.

CaSS workers and trustees have met together to pray once a month for over a decade. We pray for Sheffield school staff, students, governors, for issues affecting schools, children and young people and of course for the work of CaSS.

CaSS Workspace

This has been the first academic year with no CaSS office. Jacqueline (6 hours a week) and Fiona (20 hours a week) have worked from home. This has been a new way of working which has been very successful.

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Management Group Report

September 2021 - September 2022

As with many other activities and organisations, the past year for CaSS has seen a variety of ups and downs. Covid was rampant last autumn and winter, with few activities in schools, and meetings held by Zoom. However, our prayer group and our planning continued, and we were delighted that the annual Joined Up Conference took place in real life in March. Numbers were inevitably reduced from previous years, but it was still a very enjoyable and worthwhile event, held at St Thomas's, Crookes and Wesley Hall, Crookes. Our Schools Links Advisor, Fiona Walton, did a significant part of the organising on behalf of the planning group which included people from the Church of England, the Methodist Church and the United Reformed Church.

Our annual School Chaplaincy training course was also able to be held in real life in June and July, with about a dozen people taking the course, bringing the total trained so far to over 60 people. Many of them work in schools, although they do not usually call themselves chaplains. Over 40 of them stay in touch with each other in a private Facebook group. As in previous years, the feedback was highly complimentary. Rachel McCallam again joined Fiona in leading this course, but this year's course will be Rachel's final one. Her work commitments prevent her from continuing, but we are very grateful for all her work with this course, the annual conference and as a trustee over many years.

As well as these two major activities, Fiona has continued working with Open the Book, Arise Sheffield, Together for Sheffield, and several other local and national Christian organisations. She has also supported churches and individual Christians across the city, and has provided a wide range of resources for our website (www.cass-su.org.uk/resource-hub), which is well worth visiting. Fiona has been very well assisted by our Administrator, Jacqueline Ryan. As well as the website, between them they provide an active presence for CaSS on social media

(see the end of this document for CaSS' social media details). We are very much blessed by the work they do.

We are very pleased to have gained two new trustees: Philippa Dand and Cherry Mair, who have provided very helpful new insights and suggestions, and who have lowered our average age considerably! We are very sorry to have had two resignations. Diana Durie has been involved in CaSS since its creation, and has been a tireless supporter of all our activities, both practically and spiritually. She has always had a city-wide perspective and has been a strong and wise encourager. She resigned due to ill-health, and our thoughts and prayers are with her in these difficult times. Philip Winn has been a very valuable trustee in the last couple of years, with a wealth of knowledge and experience from across the country. He became our Chair in 2021, but felt he had to resign this summer. We are now seeking actively seeking a new Chair of Trustees.

CaSS is very pleased to maintain good links with other Christian organisations, often through Fiona's activities. She is a member both of Sheffield City Council's SACRE, which addresses the teaching of RE in our local schools, and of the Diocesan Board of Education. She is a networker/ambassador for Prayer Spaces in Schools, and the Regional Trainer and Development Officer for Yorkshire for Open The Book, which prepares primary school assemblies using drama groups from local churches. She has also achieved a certificate for completing training for Understanding Christianity: Training for School Leaders. The trustees are also holding discussions about the nature of our relationship with Scripture Union.

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Treasurer's Report

September 2021 - September 2022

A summary of accounts is shown in the table below:

	2021 - 2022	2020 - 2021
Income	£19,042	£22,268
Expenditure	£20,954	£19,628
Surplus	-£1,912	£2,640
Reserves	£4,143	£6,055

Income fell from £22,268 in 2020-21 to £19,042 in the current year. This was due to the loss of a number of regular donors who had supported us for many years. This year we had support from 19 individual donors, including some new ones, 6 churches and grants from 2 trusts. Expenditure rose a little but less than it might because of economies such as in printing, telephone and office costs. We are truly grateful to all those who support us with gifts large and small, but we do continue to be dependent on grants from trusts to keep CaSS running.

The charity had a deficit of £1,912 this year as against a surplus of £2,640 for 2020-21 and our reserves fell to £4,143. These reserves are held in account at Lloyds Bank. To a large extent these reserves represent grants from trusts which will be used up in the coming year to fund the costs of ongoing projects. We are currently applying to several trusts and would welcome new donors.

We are thankful to Almighty God for His provision for the work of CaSS and continue to trust Him for the coming years.
