


As usual there was a wide range of workshops available:

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Management Group Report

September 2022 - September 2023

We are very pleased that our regular activities have continued much more normally in 2023, following the disruption caused by Covid in recent years. The annual Joined Up Conference continued to attract people from all over the North of England and the Midlands, with excellent feedback for the talks, workshops and other events. Unfortunately, we were not able to hold a School Chaplaincy training course in the summer, as numbers were not viable. We hope revised dates in early spring will prove more popular. Our excellent Schools Links Advisor, Fiona Walton, edited one edition of the Arise Sheffield magazine with many interesting features about youth events in schools and churches. She also helped organise a very successful visit to Sheffield by Bob Hartman, as well as Open the Book training, networking, individual support, membership of the Diocesan Board of Education and SACRE, linking with Prayers Spaces, and other activities, all using just half of each week. We are also blessed by all the help given by our Administrator, Jacqueline Ryan, who works one day a week, supporting Fiona in maintaining the website and our social media presence, sending out mailings including this annual report, and in other ways.

The past year has been very significant for CaSS for two reasons. Firstly, since our formation we have always been formally associated with Scripture Union (SU), in recent years as a mission partner. We have always valued this link. Both our Schools Link Advisors, Linda Chambers and Fiona Walton, and the Trustees, have attended various SU events and training, we have participated in SU initiatives, and we have had good relations with the SU office and regional reps. However, in more recent years SU has published a revised Memorandum of Understanding for mission partners which included a lifestyle statement. It seemed to the Trustees that one small phrase of just 6 words within this lifestyle statement had the potential to seriously jeopardise our good relationships with the state schools which form the great majority of Sheffield schools.

We prayed and debated about this at length within the Trustees, and engaged in a long period of discussion with SU about whether it was absolutely required to accept this small phrase, or whether we could formally associate with SU in a different way, for example as a resource partner, but no alternative was possible. The Trustees, irrespective of their personal views, felt they could not sign up to a document that, if it became public, could seriously impair our work with state schools. When we informed SU of this, they confirmed that we could not continue as a mission partner. We are therefore now independent of SU, although we are permitted to keep our website address and email addresses unchanged. The discussions were cordial throughout, and we maintain good personal links as individuals, and in a small number of informal ways, but this is a matter of significant regret to us.

The second significant event was the passing of Diana Durie, known to almost everyone as Di. She was a founding member of the Trust, and served the Trust in various capacities throughout its existence. She supported us practically and financially, and certainly no less importantly, she supported us with her wisdom and her vision. She was always quick to remind us of our calling to the whole of the city and to the whole of the Gospel. Her insight and her advice were only matched by her commitment and her dedication. She remained a Trustee until the last year or so of her life, and a prayer supporter until the very end of her life. We have sorely missed Di.

We continue to operate without a Chair of Trustees, despite our best efforts to recruit one. Several people have been asked and have declined, generally because of other commitments. We therefore take it in turns to chair our meetings. We have been able to recruit one new Trustee this year, Linda Chambers, who brings a wealth of experience with her as the Schools Links Advisor from the beginning of CaSS until 2011. We also now have two very valuable observers who make important contributions at our meetings: Rosie Blackett, Children's Minister at All Saints Ecclesall, and Billie Thaw, co-leader of the Oakes, a young people's and children's Christian activity centre. The five new people who have joined us in the last two years have greatly invigorated our Trustee meetings.

After an anxious period in the Spring when there were cash flow problems, we were grateful to receive substantial financial help from the Church Burgesses and the Sheffield Evangelical Fellowship. This has gone a long way towards replacing our fixed-term funding over six years by the Sheffield Methodist Circuit and over three years by the Anglican Diocese. We are very grateful for this help, and for the churches and individuals who also fund us, and in some cases have done so continually for many years. Nevertheless, we still have work to do to maintain our finances, and we have a bid to the Laing Trust currently under consideration.

It is likely that the next two or three years will also be very significant for CaSS. Fiona is considering taking retirement, and two or three of the older Trustees are considering finishing at the same time. The remaining Trustees will need to consider how best to continue the work, including the recruitment of a new Schools Links Advisor, and ensuring that sufficient on-going regular funding is in place to support this. It may also be that this is the time to bring this work, unique in England, to an end, with the belief that a different or new approach may be needed. We will hold these discussions and decisions very much in prayer and seek God's guidance in all respects. This will be a major item at our AGM.

You are warmly invited to attend our AGM, which will be held on Friday 8th December 2023 at 9.30am at Bents Green Methodist Church (upstairs lounge) on the junction of Ringinglow Road and Knowle Lane (S11 7PU). Light refreshments will be provided. Please let me know if you are coming so that we can prepare the refreshments. We expect to finish by 11.30am.

I am very grateful to all the Trustees and other people mentioned above, and to our other Trustees, Richard Donkin, Alan Nickless (Treasurer), Cherry Mair and Philippa Dand.

We are all very grateful to our prayer and financial supporters. Our work for the Gospel in linking Christians and Churches with the school communities of Sheffield is entirely dependent on your support and generosity.

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Treasurer's Report

September 2022 - September 2023

A summary of accounts is shown in the table below:

Income rose slightly from £19,024 in 2022-2021 to £21,122 in the current year. This year we had support from 17 individual donors, including two new ones, six churches and grants from two trusts. We are truly grateful to all who support us with gifts large and small, but we do continue to be dependent on grants from trusts to keep CaSS running.

The charity had a surplus of £532 this year as against a deficit of £1,912 for 2021-2022 and our reserves stood at £4,676. These reserves are held on account at Lloyds Bank and represent grants from trusts which will be used up in the coming year to fund the costs of ongoing projects. We raised salaries in line with national guidelines. We are currently applying to several trusts to enable us to continue our work and always welcome new donors.

We are thankful to Almighty God for His provision for the work of CaSS and continue to trust Him for the coming years.
